Background Continues

The Municipality decided to have a meeting with street hawkers to find out how could the problem be solved out.

The reason was that the municipality wanted to have the views of the hawkers and not just push them to an area that will not be economically viable for them. The hawkers decided that the present area where most of them were selling from was the ideal area for the project.



Background Continues

The place where the hawkers Hive was constructed is on the road to the taxi rank and is also nearby the Shoprite where most of our people are purchasing from and also near the banks for people to can see what is being sold by the hawkers.



Municipal Bylaws

The Municipality did not really have bylaws regulating the hawkers in the municipal area understanding that, that is the only way of how people could make a living but rather came up with a plan to formalize the area they are using. The then **DPLG** was consulted for funding of the building and funding was approved.

Present Status

The Municipality established and elected a Hawkers Hive committee which was to assist the Municipality in taking care of the hive.

A constitution was drafted and approved by all hawkers and includes fees that should be paid monthly for municipal services.

The place is kept clean on a daily basis



Challenges

Ladybrand is the most fast growing town in Mantsopa and for that reason we are faced with immigrants entering the town in high numbers.

This people also need a living and they have started selling their goods around the corners of the town.

The marketing of our people's products is also a challenge as this immigrants are selling their goods at a cheaper price than the residents of Ladybrand
